
Hampton Pool Users Vote YES!

Hampton Pool Trust held an important General Meeting in May to gain approval from their Members to push ahead with the exciting plans to develop and update the pool.



The Trust was absolutely delighted to receive a resounding vote of confidence and clear signal from Hampton Pool Trust members that updating the changing rooms, improving the café and building a gym for all the community is what is needed to keep Hampton Pool the community gem we all know and love.

The members' vote, which supported the implementation of the current plans subject to planning approval and appropriate funding, was backed up by a recent survey which went to all users the Pool. 87% of those who responded to the survey were in favour of the plans to update the pool to meet evolving community needs.



Hampton Pool Trust is made up of a voluntary elected Board of Trustees, some of whom have been working on these plans for over six years. The plans which are focused around improving the swimming experience and ensuring the pool's facilities are used all year round have been submitted to Richmond Council.

Hampton Pool Trust eagerly awaits the approval of these plans that will benefit the local community as a whole and inspire healthy activities for all for the long-term.

Hampton Pool Trust (HPT) is a small, independent, not for profit company and educational charity.

It is run by volunteers from the local community with a vision to maintain Hampton Pool as a safe, welcoming, enjoyable, sustainable and inspirational heated, public open air swimming environment, all year round.

The Trust owns the building and the pool and exists to secure the long term future of the pool for community use. Hampton Pool is managed on behalf of Hampton Pool Trust by YMCA St Paul's Group. Both are registered charities.

Building improvement plans survey results

An online survey was recently sent to all users of Hampton Pool who have indicated they were happy to receive emails from **Hampton Pool Trust.**

This survey is just part of the extensive consultations the Trust has completed over the last few years to allow users, residents and members to have a say in how the Pool evolves. Of those who responded (around 10% of the user base emailed) 87% of those surveyed in favour of the Trust's plans to redevelop and update the pool. On the key areas that the plans address, those that responded were in agreement with the proposed improvements were:

Changing Rooms

Gym & Studios

Café & Seating Area
