Chair's Welcome by Jane Savidge



This Chair's welcome to Poolside Chat is my last as Chair of Hampton Pool Trust as I will be stepping down in January 2024. It has been a pleasure and a privilege to chair the charity responsible for Hampton Pool. Work has been underway to recruit a new chair and we are close to confirming the appointment. We look forward to introducing the Chair to pool users early next year.

I have enjoyed writing these introductions to keep you in touch with our work and developments at the pool and this winter issue is no exception. We are at a significant point in the lead up to the start of the Hampton Pool building redevelopment. The approval to proceed granted by Richmond Planning and the Greater London Authority in February 2022 ends in February 2025. 2024 is therefore critical for Hampton Pool and HPT as we must raise sufficient additional funding to make a material start on construction before our planning permission runs out.

Updates about the building have appeared in previous newsletters as Trust plans to develop the building have a long history. The question everyone asks, whether members of the charity, pool staff or pool users, is what is happening and when.

As both the 'what' and the 'when' depend on having funding in place to start construction, this issue has a particular focus on fundraising and how the pool community can help. It also includes an update on our latest Summer Picnic Concerts season, as our largest annual fundraiser; an insight into what's happening at the pool; and a profile of Teddington Masters Swimming Club, a local sports club using Hampton Pool for club sessions and training.

Teddington Swimming Club Masters Profile

With a membership that's grown to 234 members this year, Teddington Swimming Club Masters (TSCM) are a successful sports club who train regularly at Hampton Pool. *From an interview with Andy Hooper:*



We are very proud of the success we and our swimmers have achieved this year. In March, the team won the Bracknell Masters open competition. July saw one swimmer go to the World Masters Championships in Japan and secure a Gold and two Bronze places. In September, two of our swimmers represented Great Britain in the European Down Syndrome Swimming Championships where one of them gained a Silver and a Bronze and both helped GB to finish as the competition overall winners. In October, at the Great Britain Masters swimming championships in Sheffield, out of 276 clubs represented, we secured second place in the overall Team competition. Individually we had 42 top three finishes (17 Gold, 18 Silver and 8 Bronze) and in team relays we had 24 top three finishes (6 Gold, 13 Silver and 5 Bronze).

However, we are not just about competitive swimming, TSCM seeks to promote lifelong fitness for adults aged 18 and over through regular swimming. Our coaching team provide high-quality structured training sessions in a friendly, supportive and fun atmosphere.

Swimmers of diverse backgrounds and abilities are welcome. We offer membership for adults looking to return to swimming and our 'Developmental Masters' which has a focus on technique. There are options for those who just want to train for fitness and looking to compete in Masters competitive events and we've even had a number of swimmers join us to train and complete cross-channel swims!"

We have welcomed lots of new members of the team in the last few months, including seven new lifeguards and five new swim teachers, enabling us to extend our range of classes.

Spending time together as a team is important to us and Caolan, one of our duty managers, recently launched a staff running club, a 5k run every Friday morning in Bushy Park. Helping us build the team as well as keeping us fit!

There's a great atmosphere at the pool at this time of the year and we are working hard to get everything ready for the season. The Christmas tree is a magnificent 25ft this year and 1.6km of Christmas lights are being installed around the site, put in place by our trusted team of lifeguards. They have all been trained and have come up with lots of creative ideas, including energy efficient measures around the pool and for the tree.

Pool Building: what's holding things up?

Covid, global conflicts, energy price rises and the cost of living crisis have had a financial impact, increasing the cost of constructing our new pool building, restricting grants and reducing the surplus available to repay loans.

Due to this, Hampton Pool Trust Board have prioritised what can be achieved in a first phase of work using funds already collected and more limited grants.

The current Phase One plan includes the lift to the upper floor; a roof over part of the sun deck to create an indoor space for winter shelter; a year-round café and community space; and a place to install solar photo voltaic (PV) panels; and other energy saving infrastructure.

On the ground floor, moving the entrance to replace the current studio will make space to redevelop and upgrade the changing rooms. A new larger studio will be built next to the new entrance giving increased capacity for classes. The new gym, a second studio and major work on the plant room are delayed, with the aim to address these over a longer period as part of a second phase.

All the Phase One elements are critical to the full development: ensuring that the refurbished building is accessible and sustainable; meets customer expectations; and supports the future of the building. Phase One must not compromise later phases or the essential revenue streams for the continuing operation of the pool.

As Trustees of the charity, HPT Board have a responsibility to protect the financial resources of the Trust so that we do not put Hampton Pool at risk. We must assure ourselves that when we give the green light to start construction, we have sufficient resources confirmed to complete a standalone first phase of the building development. We must also provide assurances to both The Royal Parks and London Borough of Richmond.

Although we could 'value engineer' the works now, the Board view is that to remove any of the Phase One elements would compromise the scheme. We are therefore working hard to raise further funding to close the gap and we hope to have your continuing help with this in 2024.

We have significant work to do to reach the £5 million needed but hope that grant applications currently submitted or under development, combined with a further search for support from potential funders will get us closer and with help from pool users and the community we can finally get there. Grant applications currently submitted include an application to the Swimming Pool Support Capital Fund and to Richmond Community Infrastructure Fund and further applications are at planning stage. ≈
